

### Sonata in E Minor Hob XVI 34 (Joseph Haydn)

Haydn (1732-1809) was an Austrian composer of the classical period.

This sonata is one of his later compositions, which was composed around 1783 and first published in London the following year.

This first movement, shows the work of Haydn at his most passionate.

### Nocturne in E Flat Major Op.9 no.2 (Frédéric Chopin)

Chopin (1810-1849) was a Polish composer and pianist of the Romantic period. He composed primarily for solo piano.

Nocturnes are usually pieces inspired by night and they are generally very relaxing and calming in nature.

The nocturne in E flat major is one of the most famous pieces by Chopin. He dedicated his op.9 nocturnes, a set of 3 to Maria Pleyel, one of his students and the wife of an acquaintance.
