

Born in 1840, Oskar Rieding is a German

Violinist and composer of the Romantic period. He studied music at the Academy of Musical Arts in Berlin and subsequently at the Leipzig Conservatory.



Rieding is best remembered for his composition for violin which are highly regarded for their pedagogical value. Many of these pieces have remained popular with teachers and pupils, included among them the violin Concerto in B minor published in Brussels in 1909. Designed for young violinist who has achieved some fluency and accuracy in First Position, this concerto has also been played by famous musicians namely Itzhak Perlman. Rieding also composed the Concertino in Hungarian style first published in 1905.
